In preparation of the upcoming holiday celebration, the Kinoomaadziwin Education Body (KEB) is pleased to share this Anishinaabemowin language resource with all Participating First Nations of the Anishinabek Education System.

As part of our ongoing efforts to support communities in language revitalization, the KEB will continue to develop resources and tools that may be used by the Participating First Nations at your convenience.

In the following pages, you will find several activity pages and word lists that may be used to support students in creating messages related to the holiday season through cards, word challenges, and artwork, etc.

Teachers are welcome to use the resources for in-class lessons or extra-curricular activities. For in-class lessons, we recommend beginning by working through the words as a group and sounding them out together to practice speaking Anishinaabemowin or Lenape.

Students may then move into working with the words to create their own personal arts and crafts related to the holiday season. These can be for themselves, or they can create something for their classmates, friends, and family.

Included in this resource package you will find several activities that may be used at your convenience in the days leading up to the holiday season. The resources include:

- 1 list of common holiday sayings in Anishinaabemowin
- 1 list of common holiday words in Lenape
- 2 pre-made holiday cards
- 2 holiday colouring pages
- 1 design your own ornament
- 1 holiday I Spy page
- 1 holiday crossword puzzle accompanied with a teacher answer sheet
- 1 set of 6 holiday memory flash cards in Anishinaabemowin

To encourage the use of oral language, students can say the words they find in the pages out loud, while doing the activities. This may help them to practice speaking Anishinaabemowin.

The activities enclosed in the following pages were developed using the Nbisiing dialect of Anishinaabemowin. They are geared to support students in grades JK to 6, but they can be used and enjoyed by language learners of all ages!




